The Japan Media Arts Festival 20th Anniversary Exhibition Executive Committee presents the "Japan Media Arts Festival 20th Anniversary Exhibition – Power to Change" from October 15 to November 6, 2016 at 331 Arts Chiyoda and other locations. Since its inception in 1997, the festival has presented awards to outstanding works in each of its four divisions: Arts, Entertainment, Animation, and Manga. As a comprehensive festival of Media Arts (Japanese: *Media Geijutsu*), it also provides a platform for appreciation of award-winning and other notable works, and has in recent years been demonstrating its continuing evolution as an established annual international festival. This exhibition will exhibit or screen award-winning works and jury selections from previous Festivals chosen by four past jury members in order to exemplify diverse forms of expression and the changing nature of Media Arts, focusing on the keyword "change". By presenting a retrospective of 20 years of the festival, this exhibition provides a precious opportunity to fully comprehend Media Arts as well as the all-encompassing changes and trends in society, culture, and technology that took place over the same period. What is the relationship between these changes and trends and the inherent power of the works? This exhibition serves as an opportunity to ponder over the future of Media Arts as an extension of their "Power to Change".



Distant and Close-Range View of Manga History (Symposium)

Japan Media Arts Festival has a 20 year history; Manga-style Expression dates far back beyond that. "Changes" can be observed in the 20 years of the JMAF; a larger "change" may be observed when history is viewed from the whole span of time from the Edo Period. Through studying the "changes" from the Edo Period and the "changes" which took place in the JMAF, the past and future of Manga-style expression is considered and the potential that springs out from the history of Manga will be discussed.

The Past and Future of Media Arts

The late 1990s when the JMAF, supported by the Ministry of Culture of Japan, began coincides with the period when great attention was being focused on media arts, and in which media arts-related facilities began to open around the world. An artist who is actively engaged in the field of media arts as well as interviewers who are well acquainted with the contemporary art scene will discuss how expectations and conditions surrounding media arts have changed in the course of two decades, what has what has not been accomplished in current media arts, as well as the potential for the future. The trajectory of media arts which has been developing during this period will be put into a historical perspective, and future challenges as well as issues in exhibiting and archiving will be shared with the audience.

Abstract:

In recent years, we have witnessed the establishment of a new trend in media artists' style of activity; they freely traverse the fields of art, design, and entertainment, sometimes engaging in works commissioned by clients, and at other times expressing themselves through creative activities in the arts field. They also tend to establish production entities together with fellow artists rather than engaging in activities on their own. The emergence of new artists who engage in such expansive realms of activity in expressing themselves has been increasing in prominence since the late 1990s, which coincides with the beginning of the annual Japan Media Arts Festival. In this exposition, we will give a selective introduction to works of art by these new creators.
